Degree Program Description

The German degree is the exploration of the language, literature, and culture of German-speaking countries (Germany, Austria, and Switzerland) and their place in Europe and the world. Students combine coursework in German and English to develop skills in critical thinking, cultural awareness, media literacy, and linguistic competence. MU German majors commonly double major and have successfully pursued careers in business, engineering, finance, law, journalism, government service, teaching, medicine, and the sciences, as well as in art, literature, philosophy, music, and film. Students engage with cultural and philosophical traditions and learn about key issues affecting media, technology, art, politics, and society in present-day German-speaking countries as well as at key moments in its past.

Major Program Requirements

The major in German consists of 27 credits in German or in courses related to German speaking countries in History, Art History, Film Studies, Digital Global Studies, or the School of Languages, Literatures, and Cultures beyond GERMAN 2100. Students are encouraged to pursue internships for course credit, and have options to complete courses in English that focus on German and European cultural studies. The German faculty strongly encourages all majors to spend at least one semester studying abroad at a German university. Equivalents to all the required courses for the major are available through study abroad.

German majors commonly pursue one of two tracks. The first is focused more strongly on linguistic competence; students take more courses taught in German, including in single or multi-semester study abroad experiences. The second track involves more classes taught in English and is focused more on cultural competency. Both tracks pair well with majors in business, engineering, international studies, journalism, history, art history, the natural sciences, and more.
