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International Studies (https://internationalstudies.missouri.edu)

The Bachelor of Arts in International Studies is an individually designed major with a strong multicultural and global focus. Students in the major have the opportunity to design a major that reflects their own interests and goals. The increased level of flexibility requires a higher level of commitment than is typical of traditional majors because students MUST do the work of building their own degree.

International Studies majors acquire analytical skills and knowledge that will enable them to understand and meaningfully engage with the quickly evolving global community. The program prepares students for graduate study and careers in academia, teaching, law, business, public policy, humanitarian aid, non-profit organizations, government, and diplomacy. Students in the program will study advanced second language and participate in a study abroad experience to fulfill degree requirements.

International Business (https://internationalstudies.missouri.edu/node/9/)

The dual degree program in International Business leads to the BS in Business Administration from the Trulaske College of Business and the BA in International Studies from the College of Arts & Science. This degree typically takes 4 1/2 to 5 years to complete. Students in the program will study advanced second language and participate in a study abroad experience to fulfill degree requirements.

In addition to developing a deeper knowledge in the emphasis areas described above, International Studies and International Business majors acquire analytical skills and knowledge that will enable them to understand and meaningfully engage with the quickly evolving global community. International Studies graduates from Mizzou gain competencies in the following areas.

Global and International Interconnections: Students will analyze how international processes and structures influence local and traditional life and cultures, and how local cultures can also often have a global impact.

Multidisciplinary and Interdisciplinary Perspectives: Students will analyze global interconnectedness through multiple disciplinary lenses including the impact of historical, political, geographical, economic, and environmental processes on present-day global structures and related issues and challenges.

Cross-Cultural Knowledge, Experience, and

Competency: Through structured analysis of other cultures and first-hand cross-cultural experience, including study abroad and advanced language study, students will gain a deep understanding of at least one other culture, and factors that can facilitate or hinder positive cross-cultural interactions.

International Studies Departmental Honors Requirements

Prerequisites

- Declared International Studies major
- Senior academic standing during the semester in which INTL_S 4950 is taken
- 3.3 or above cumulative GPA
- 3.5 or above GPA in MU International Studies courses

In the semester prior to pursuing departmental honors:



- Interested student submits a written proposal for a substantial project involving original research to a tenured, tenure track, or NTT faculty member working in the student's area of interest
- Faculty mentor must agree to supervise the project faculty members are not obligated to supervise honors projects
- Student provides the International Studies Director hard copies of the proposal and an unofficial transcript, after receiving approval from the supervising professor

During the semester that the project is developed

- Register for and successfully complete three-credit hours of INTL_S 4950. Projects initiated in other courses may also be eligible with advanced approval from the International Studies Director
- The resulting product should be a thesis of 25 40 pages or project of comparable rigor
- Before a grade is submitted, the student must present their research (either through a short colloquium, a committee, poster display, or alternative method approved by the supervising professor)

Graduate

INTL_S 2101: Topics in International Studies

Organized study of selected topics. Subjects, specific content, and credits will vary from semester to semester. Graded on A-F basis only.

Credit Hour: 1-6

Prerequisites: Sophomore standing and instructor consent required

INTL_S 3001: Topics in International Studies - General

Organized study of selected topics. Subjects and earnable credit may vary from semester to semester.

Credit Hour: 1-6

INTL_S 4290: Pre-Departure Seminar for the TaLK Program

Prior to beginning the TaLK Program in Korea, students will explore Korean language, culture and educational system through seminars and workshops provided by the Asian Affairs Staff and guest speakers. Graded on A-F basis only.

Credit Hours: 3

Prerequisites: instructor's consent

INTL_S 4940: SLLC Global Internship

(same as LG_LT_CT 4940). Cross-cultural and/or multilingual work experience in an organization that is relevant to SLLC curriculum. Enrollment limited to students who are in good standing. Internship

often counts toward major/minor requirements; check with instructor or language section.

Credit Hour: 0-6

Prerequisites: Instructor consent required

INTL_S 4950: Undergraduate Research in International Studies

This is a course that allows junior and senior International Studies students to engage in advanced individual research under faculty supervision on topics relevant to international studies. The research can lead to a thesis paper or be project-based. The outcomes and intended final product of the research must be arranged by the student and faculty member prior to registration. Graded on A-F basis only.

Credit Hours: 3

Prerequisites: Junior or senior standing, and departmental consent required

INTL_S 4960: Readings in International Studies

Independent readings with supervisory faculty member. Open only to International Studies majors. May be repeated up to a maximum of 6 hours.

Credit Hour: 1-6

INTL_S 4960W: Readings in International Studies - Writing Intensive Independent readings with supervisory faculty member. Open only to International Studies majors. May be repeated up to a maximum of 6 hours.
