Admissions

Applicants are required to meet two sets of minimum qualifications for admission: the requirements of the PhD in Educational Leadership and Policy Analysis (https://gradschool.missouri.edu/degreecategory/educational-leadership-policy-analysis/) and the minimum requirements of the Graduate School (https://gradschool.missouri.edu/admissions/eligibility-process/). Because requirements vary, you *must* refer to a degree program's graduate admission page to learn about specific admission criteria, application deadlines, eligibility and application process. Your application materials will be reviewed by both the Graduate School and the degree program to which you've applied before official admission to the University of Missouri.

Applicants to the PhD in Educational Leadership and Policy Analysis with an emphasis in Higher Education must hold a master's degree from an accredited institution. Competitive candidates will demonstrate:

- A strong alignment with the program's mission to critically shape educational policy and leadership in higher education
- Commitment to research and inquiry that promotes equity, access, and institutional transformation
- Clear professional and academic goals that connect with ELPA faculty expertise
