

PhD in Human Environmental Sciences with Emphasis in Textile and Apparel Management

Degree Requirements

The degree requires a minimum of 78 credit hours beyond the bachelor's degree, with at least 15 credit hours at the 8000 level or above exclusive of research, problems, and independent study. It is expected for students to have a minimum of 9 credits in Research/Qualitative/Quantitative methods, of which 3 credits will be Research Methods and 3 credits will be Statistics. Students are required to take T_A_M 8087 Seminar in Clothing and Textiles, T_A_M 8130 Supply Chain Management in the Global Softgoods Industry and T_A_M 9190 Theory Development and Evaluation in Textile and Apparel Research.
