

Certificate in American Constitutional Democracy

Requirements

The certificate in American Constitutional Democracy recognizes students who have completed twelve (12) hours of coursework at the University of Missouri on the history, theory, and practice of constitutional democracy in the US and around the globe. In contrast to the minor, students pursuing the certificate are not required to complete a study abroad course, internship, or other experiential class.

Note: courses used to satisfy a major requirement may also count toward a certificate. However, students may not receive credit for both the certificate and the minor in American Constitutional Democracy and cannot apply transfer credit to the certificate.

Students must maintain a "B" average (3.0 GPA) in all certificate coursework. All coursework must be completed at MU.

A certificate consists of at least 12 credits; at least 12 credits must be taken in MU course work. Students must meet the minimum GPA requirements for a certificate, which in no case can be lower than 2.0. In addition, a student cannot receive a grade lower than a C- in any course applied towards a certificate in the College.
