

Minor in Rhetoric and Writing Studies

The Rhetoric and Writing Studies Minor focuses on courses in rhetoric and composition and courses at the intersections of writing, language, and culture. Giving a student the opportunities to study the diverse rhetorical contexts in which writing is created, engage in the study of situated language and writing practices, and learn methodologies for studying and creating their own rhetorical productions across genres, media, and modalities. Upon completion of the minor, students will be versed in the theories, methodologies, and practices of writing and language use in diverse contexts and have experience applying them to their own writing and rhetorical practices.

Requirements

- 15 total hours from courses listed below
- 3 hours of required courses and 12 hours of electives
- At least 3 credit hours must be taken at the level 3000 or above
- A grade of C- or above must be earned in all minor coursework
- A minimum GPA of 2.0 in all combined minor coursework is required
- A minimum of 9 credit hours must be completed in MU coursework

A minor consists of at least 15 credits, including at least 6 credits numbered 2000 or above, 9 of the required credits must be taken in MU course work. This requirement can be reduced from 9 to 6 at the discretion of an individual department. Students must meet the minimum GPA requirements for a minor, which in no case can be lower than 2.0. In addition, a student cannot receive a grade lower than a C- in any course applied towards a minor in the College.
