

# BGS in General Studies

## Degree Program Description

The Bachelor of General Studies (BGS) is designed for students who want to build an individualized major to meet their educational and career objectives. Students who pursue the BGS design their program of study across three areas of study called component areas. Career options for BGS majors are as varied as their combination of component areas. The BGS degree is intended for students pursuing a first bachelor's degree and will not be approved as a second bachelor's degree. A student who has earned a degree in General Studies may not pursue a second degree in a field used as a component of the first degree.

## Major Program Requirements

The BGS degree requires a minimum of 120 credit hours. In addition to University (<http://catalog.missouri.edu/academicdegreerequirements/universityrequirements/>), general education (<http://catalog.missouri.edu/academicdegreerequirements/generaleducationrequirements/>), and College of Arts and Science (<http://catalog.missouri.edu/collegeofartsandscience/#undergraduatetext>) requirements, students must also meet the following major program requirements. All major requirements in the College of Arts and Science must be completed with grades of C- or higher unless otherwise indicated.

The BGS major is comprised of 45 credit hours across three areas of study, or component areas. Component areas consist of coursework either from a single program, or from thematically related coursework across multiple programs. Component courses may come from any department or program at MU, or through approved transfer coursework.

Component area requirements:

- 15 credit hours per component
- A minimum of 6 credit hours per component numbered 3000 or above
- A minimum C- grade in each component area course
- A minimum 2.0 cumulative GPA in each component area
- A capstone, which may be taken within the 15 credit hours of a single component, or as part of the 120 hours required for graduation.

A student who has earned a degree in General Studies may not pursue a second degree in a field used as a component of the first degree.
