Degree Program Description

The discipline of Russian studies involves the systematic, first-hand exploration of the language, literature, and cultures of diverse Russian-speaking countries and Russophone cultures around the world. The liberal arts foundation of this discipline prepares students for careers in a wide variety of fields, including journalism, tourism, diplomacy, and education.

Major Program Requirements

The major in Russian consists of 27 credits in Russian beyond RUSS 1200. Within these 27 hours, students must meet minimum requirements within two categories: language, and literature and culture (see below). The Russian faculty strongly encourages all majors to spend at least one semester (or summer) studying abroad, preferably after their second year of the language. In addition, students must meet all degree, college and university graduation requirements (<http://catalog.missouri.edu/academicdegreerequirements/universityrequirements/>), including those for university general education (<http://catalog.missouri.edu/academicdegreerequirements/generaleducationrequirements/>).
