

# PhD in Textile and Apparel Management

The PhD in Textile and Apparel Management prepares students to become leading scholars and educators in a dynamic and global industry shaped by innovation, sustainability, and evolving consumer trends. This highly regarded program explores cutting-edge research topics such as apparel product development, supply chain management, consumer behavior, digital technologies, and sustainability. Students receive rigorous research training and benefit from close faculty mentorship, an interdisciplinary curriculum, and opportunities for teaching and research assistantships. Graduates are well-prepared for careers in academia as well as research and leadership roles in major organizations across the textile and apparel sector.

## Degree Requirements

The PhD in Textile and Apparel Management degree requires a minimum of 78 credit hours beyond the bachelor's degree, with at least 15 credit hours at the 8000 level or above exclusive of research, problems, and independent study. It is expected students will have a minimum of 9 credits in Research/Qualitative/Quantitative methods, with at least 3 credits in Research Methods and 3 credits in Statistics. Students are required to take T\_A\_M 8087 Seminar in Clothing and Textiles, T\_A\_M 8130 Supply Chain Management in the Global Softgoods Industry, and T\_A\_M 9190T\_A\_M 9190 Theory Development and Evaluation in Textile and Apparel Research. This degree is for resident students only.

- Statement of professional objectives
- Three letters of recommendation
- Official transcripts from every college or university you have attended
- Your official GRE scores (sent directly from the Educational Testing Service) - We do not consider GMAT scores.
- Latest vitae or résumé
- A 2-minute video to show about who you are, why you want to pursue graduate degrees, and what your career goals are
- Language test scores if international student (see more from <https://gradschool.missouri.edu/admissions/eligibility-process/international-applicants/>)
- A digital design portfolio if pursuing design research
- Writing samples optional

Fall admission deadline: January 15

Applicants who submit by this date will receive full consideration for early financial support considerations. Late submission will not be considered for financial support.
