Admissions

Applicants are required to meet two sets of minimum qualifications for admission: the requirements of the PhD in Educational Leadership and Policy Analysis (<https://gradschool.missouri.edu/degreecategory/educational-leadership-policy-analysis/>) and the minimum requirements of the Graduate School (<https://gradschool.missouri.edu/admissions/eligibility-process/>). Because requirements vary, you *must* refer to a degree program's graduate admission page to learn about specific admission criteria, application deadlines, eligibility and application process. Your application materials will be reviewed by both the Graduate School and the degree program to which you've applied before official admission to the University of Missouri.

Applicants to the PhD in Educational Leadership and Policy Analysis with an emphasis in Educational Administration must hold a master's degree from an accredited institution. Preference is given to candidates with experience in PK-12 education or leadership.

Ideal applicants will demonstrate:

- A commitment to transforming school and district leadership
- Alignment with ELPA's critical approach to educational administration and equity
- A strong interest in educational policy, systems change, and social justice
